Expanded Border Exception for 'Other' Critical Workers	 The income criteria for the 'Other' Critical Worker border exception will be reduced to 1.5 times the median wage (NZD84,240 a year or NZD40.50 an hour) for roles longer than 6 months The requirement for 'Other' Critical Workers to demonstrate that the skills are not readily obtainable in New Zealand will be removed
